Thy Kingdom Come

Great crowds came to him, bringing with them the lame, the maimed, the blind, the mute, and many others. They put them at his feet, and he cured them, so that the crowd was amazed when they saw the mute speaking, the maimed whole, the lame walking, and the blind seeing. And they praised the God of Israel.

- Matthew 15:30, 31



When the early church heard about the healings that Jesus had done, they understood them as signs that the long-awaited reign of God had begun in him.

His healings echoed the prophecy of Isaiah, when he said, "Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the speechless sing for joy." (Isaiah 35:5, 6)

Each week we pray in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." And whether we call it God's kingdom, God's reign, or God's realm, it exists wherever God's will is enacted. In other words, to pray "Thy kingdom come" means the same thing as "Thy will be done," because wherever God's will is done, God's kingdom has come.

It's a radical prayer since it takes the focus away from our self and on to God. To pray that God's will be done, is to acknowledge that it is not all about what we want.

The reign of God that was inaugurated by Jesus is still transforming the world, albeit often quietly and out of the headlines.

Where are the signs of God's reign in your life?

2 Ways to Give – Electronically

For your convenience, gifts and payments can be made to Union Lutheran Church in three new ways.


1. Using a Mobile Phone: Download the free Vanco GivePlus app. Use zip code 18078 to locate Union Lutheran Church. Choose which church funds to give to, put in the amounts, and it can be securely transferred from your bank account, debit card, or credit card. Set up a username and password to make reoccurring gifts.
2. Using a Computer: Use the “Give” link on our webpage ulclv.org. You will be securely connected to Vanco GivePlus, where you can choose the church funds, your gift amounts, and your bank account, debit card, or credit card. You also have the option to set up a username and password to make reoccurring gifts.

This is all possible because of an agreement that Vanco has with the ELCA. Our church has experience with Vanco, the transaction provider for Simply Giving, and have found their financial processing services to be highly secure and accurate.

As with all credit card or debit card charges, there is a transaction fee. This will be paid by Union Lutheran Church. Vanco GivePlus will give you an option to include the transaction fee with your gift. This increases your gift by 2.65% to donate the transaction fee. This is a completely voluntary option which you can choose before your donation is finalized and processed.

Preparing for the Unexpected

A health emergency can be stressful and overwhelming. Get this essential paperwork ready in advance. It may help save your life.

1. **An up-to-date list of medical conditions and current medications**, along with any over-the-counter drugs or supplements you take. Keep a copy on your fridge and another in your wallet, along with your health insurance card. If you arrive at a hospital unconscious, the medical team will go through your purse, wallet, or phone in search of this information.
2. **Contact information.** "Every single person should have a list of who to contact, the name of their primary care doctor, and any specialists," says Latha Ganti, M.D., a professor of emergency medicine and neurology at the University of Central Florida College of Medicine. Also add an in Case of Emergency (ICE) contact to your phone and to a sticker on your case.
3. **Legal and medical documents.** William Jaquis, M.D., of the American College of Emergency Physicians, recommends keeping all of your relevant documents together and accessible, including a complete medical history for each family member, consent-to-treat forms (for children), durable power of attorney, living will, and healthcare proxy info.

No need to RSVP – just remember to come to worship on **September 15th**!





Marion Dietz by Jay Marakovits

As a representative of the Allentown Health Bureau, Marian Dietz had a passion for teaching children about skin safety. Marian enjoyed visiting schools and youth groups, and she took pride in her role as an educator about skin cancer. Throughout her experiences with children, Marian learned that stories can be extremely powerful teaching tools. This background led to Marian's picture book, *The Tater Family Vacation*.



Marian Dietz never dreamed that she would become the author of a published book. Marian wrote several stories more than 15 years ago, but she did not plan to submit them to publishing companies. Shortly after her son George passed away, Marian's story about the Tater family fell out of a folder while she was organizing a room. She was inspired to turn the story into a published book, and she sent it to Page Publishing. The story was accepted immediately.

The Tater Family Vacation is an entertaining tale of a trip to the beach, and it has an important message about skin safety for children. Marian generously donated a copy of *The Tater Family Vacation* to the Union Lutheran Church library. It will be available for families to borrow, and children will be able to learn about protecting their skin from the sun.

Marian does not have any plans for sequels about the Tater family, but she is currently working on a book about a student in middle school. This book was also accepted by Page Publishing. 

- 1:00 PM – 1:30 PM – help to box up books still remaining and taking down tables.



From the Director of Music Ministries

I have been a member of the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians for about 17 years. Our national conferences are held on the odd-numbered years and rotate among east coast, Middle America, and the west coast. From June 24 to June 27, I attended the biannual conference, themed “Leading the Church’s Song: Doing Common Things Uncommonly Well”, at Concordia University in Portland, Oregon. Our days were filled with thoughtful and insightful plenary addresses, beautifully crafted liturgical worship led by inspiring pastors and extremely skilled musicians, a traveling hymn festival held at three sites (a Lutheran church, the Roman Catholic cathedral, and a synagogue), and so many workshop opportunities it was difficult to select which ones to attend.

One of the plenary sessions, presented by The Rev. Dr. Robert Buckley Farlee, received a standing ovation upon its completion, something I have never seen in attending numerous addresses of this kind. Dr. Farlee has an extensive background as a musician, composer, theologian, and pastor. He referred to the time he was the Cantor (musician) at Christ Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, Minnesota. He firmly believes that the choir serves as ministers to the assembly, to help enhance the Word and carry the Meal.

Our conference ended, as always, with a Sending Eucharist. The sending hymn “Now Thank We All Our God”, sung with great gusto and fervor. The final stanza summarized our time together, and why we church musicians do what we do:

All praise and thanks to God the Father now be given,
the son, and Spirit blest, who reign in highest heaven,
the one eternal God, whom earth and heav’n adore;
for thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore.

1400+ and counting! That's how many worship services at ULC for which Sue has been our organist. And that number does not include Lenten services, special services, weddings and funerals. Sue became Director of Music Ministries at ULC in August, 2004. Her responsibilities include everything that happens musically in the congregation. Of course, it's a job no one can do alone. It takes devoted choir members, instrumentalists, bell ringers, singers, sound technicians, planners, and others to keep things humming along. But Sue is called to be the glue to keep it all together.

Sue was born at Easton Hospital. Her father was a farmer in Bethlehem Township and her mother was a housewife. She has one older brother, Lee Wagner.

Sue learned to play the piano at the age of 6. She still has her childhood piano, a 120-year old upright grand crafted by Melville Clark. At the age of 9 she learned to play the flute and piccolo. During her high school years at Freedom she played in the school band and orchestra as well as being a part of small ensembles and singing groups. Ron Demkee, director of the Allentown Band, was her high school director. In 1993, he invited her to join the Allentown Band. And, as you probably know, at the end of every concert when the Band plays The Stars and Stripes Forever, Sue is one of the featured piccolo players.

Sue was about 14 when she learned to play the organ. She says, "The organist at my home church was looking for someone to substitute for her. She knew my piano skills were good and I was a likely candidate to transfer to organ. I substituted for her for several years."

Sue is an alumna of West Chester University, having graduated in 1975 with a Bachelor of Science degree, cum laude, in Music Education. She also holds a Master of Arts degree in musicology from Marywood University.

There are a number of professional organizations that Sue is affiliated with: The Lehigh Valley Chapter, American Guild of Organists; Association of Lutheran Church Musicians; Local 45, American Federation of Musicians; Handbell Musicians of America; and, the Hymn Society of the United States and Canada.

Over the years, Sue has had a variety of jobs beginning with Connecticut General Life Insurance Company as a Pension Technician. She then worked for the Northeastern Bank of Pennsylvania as secretary to a Trust Officer. This was followed by a position at Marywood University where she worked in development, being involved in annual fund drives, grant writing and a capital campaign. She later became Assistant to the Director of Human Resources for the school. For her family's company, Stehly Woodcrafts, she was Office Manager and for more than ten years was a real estate agent associated with local ERA franchise offices. During all these stints she was organist on Sunday mornings for a variety of churches. For six years she was the organist at St. Mary of Mt. Carmel parish in Dunmore, PA, playing three Masses every Sunday. And before coming to ULC, Sue was the organist at Christ Church, Schoenersville (now the Synod Office) 1992-1994 and St. Stephen, Bethlehem, 1994-2004.


In 1991, Sue married Gary Hartney, a Funeral Director. She says their wedding song was Under the Boardwalk because they loved the beach so much, but "it really should have been Some Enchanted Evening." She explains by saying, "That's how we met – across a crowded room."

Sue has three stepsons, now grown and married along with 8 grandchildren. Her husband Gary is a retired Funeral Director and now works part-time for St. Luke's Hospital. He is an avid golfer. Sue says she also plays golf but is no match for her husband.

Sue loves her flute and says she "will never part with it." She plays it in our Praise Band and often plays it at other times during worship services. Her flute, made by Haynes of Boston, is a valuable, professional instrument. Indeed, she says, "Some flutes can cost as much as, and in excess of \$35,000."

Here at ULC, Sue says she is committed to both personal and congregational growth. Many folks have come to her to share their personal stories and concerns. She is very open to that and she says choir members, instrumentalists and bell ringers are always needed. Her guidance to prospective musicians is "Attend a rehearsal; you will be greeted with warmth and enthusiasm – and you'll be helping to lead the Church's song!"


