Annual Report of the Music Director By Susan Frickert

For me 2021 could best be described as "slow but steady progress!!"

Farewell, fond memories of the outdoor services of 2020: wind blowing my music pages away; bugs congregating around my head; sun glaring in my eyes; traffic noise obliterating the sounds of our anthems; frigid cold and blistering heat making us uncomfortable; raindrops and snowflakes doing their best to discourage us!

Fast forward to the beauty and calm of our sanctuary as we finally moved indoors on July 4th - what a joy for all of us! Special triple cloth singing masks had made it possible for Union Chorale and the Praise Band to sing safely, each singer six feet apart, spread out on the portable stage and choir loft area. At the time it was the safest way we could sing together, but it was very difficult to hear each other, and the masks tended to muffle our anthem texts.

My discovery of disposable singing masks that were lighter and thinner, but still effectively contained aerosols produced by singing improved that situation dramatically, as did finally being able to stand a little closer.

The Glory Ringers progressed from ringing with tables six feet apart in the Gathering Place, to tables closer together in the chancel, making it easier to share bells, see the director, and hear each other.

We witnessed big changes in the choir loft area as we brought the organ console out of the "naughty corner" essentially behind the choir loft (you mean the choir should be able to watch the director?!) Thanks to the generosity of Bob Walker, (who originally installed ULC's Rogers organ and who now owns his own organ company, Walker Technologies) many mechanical issues on the console were fixed free of charge. The drumset was relocated to the corner and elevated on the portable stage, improving the sound and making it easier for Rob Drews to see the director. A new, bigger amplifier gave guitarist Kim Kuhlman more flexibility and richer sound. My plans to recruit children's and teen's choirs were put on hold as we followed the continuing rapid spread of covid in area public schools, but with the recent development of safe vaccines for those age groups, my hope is renewed that I may be able to safely begin those choirs in fall of 2022.

-Celebration Service Honoring long-time Union Chorale singers Lois Shaffer and Ann Kern

-Three beautiful Christmas Eve Services led by Union Chorale, Praise Band, Glory Ringers, String Trio, vocal and instrumental soloists

Since Katie is doing much more than just an Assistant Office Administrator, it was agreed that her title should be changed to Communication Specialist to reflect her Audio/Visual responsibilities. She also received a substantial salary increase.

Susan was originally hired to work 15 – 20 hours per week. However, she is working a weekly average of 25.75 hours. The Director of Music Ministries job description was changed to reflect a 25 – 30 hours per week that is needed to do the job. Susan's salary was also substantially increased to reflect the amount of hours she actually works.

The Committee met with each staff person to review the previous year. The staff had to be flexible and creative to provide the worship and music ministry this past year.

With that behind us, we refocused our attention to the Future Building Maintenance Fund, which will be essential to maintaining our facility as we go forward. Contributions to this fund will be put towards large upcoming repairs to the building, including several HVAC units that will need to be replaced. The generous financial contributions of the congregation have enabled us to support our growing ministries both within our congregation and out in our community. We look forward to a new year full of worship and service to God.
