Annual Report of the Music Director By Susan Frickert

"You don't have to do great things, but the little things you are doing in your sphere of influence can be done with great conviction, great wisdom, great beauty, and great love." -Ruth Kriebel Jacobs, founder of the Choristers Guild

The above quote has always been a sort of personal mantra ever since I started directing church choirs back in my teens. 2021 has been a year of many wonderful little things happening in music ministry at ULC! We have gained new singers in both Union Chorale and the Praise Band, some new ringers in Glory Ringers. Even more exciting is how much each group has grown musically! I was able to recruit six little singers to start a Junior Choir in September. Although sports schedules prohibited many youth from participating in the teenage "modular" choir that I had also planned, I did get opportunities to work individually with several talented young singers and instrumentalists, and I'll be recruiting for another eight week module leading up to Easter.

I was thrilled to be able to reconstitute Sacred Voices, an ecumenical community choir that I had founded and directed since 2002, and which had been derailed by covid-19 restrictions in 2020 and 2021. To be able to get those singers back together safely in summer 2022 felt like a wonderful family reunion! Sadly we had lost about a dozen singers to illness and even death during that two year pandemic. But I was able to attract some new members from the Schnecksville area, including eleven singers from ULC, so we ended up with forty-eight singers and a good balance of sound. Our concert in September was enthusiastically received by a large audience, and all indications point to the fact that we will gain even more singers for summer 2023.

Then there was the amazing gift of a new organ from Emmanuel UCC in Allentown. Forced to permanently close their doors due to years of poor worship attendance and dwindling funds, they decided to give their most treasured possessions to other area churches. Because of the close relationships the congregation had maintained over the years with me, they offered their 2016 Digital Allen Organ to ULC.

Annual Report of the Music Director (continued)

All we had to do was pay for the disconnecting, moving and "organ transplant surgery," amounting to \$21.040, to acquire an instrument with newer technology worth \$75,000. Several donors stepped up to fund the project, and, as this goes to press, we are now enjoying this amazing organ. It has been a good year!

- -Our choirs and myself participated in the closing worship service for Emmanuel UCC, Allentown, during which we were given the remarkable gift of their 2016 Allen Digital Organ
- -Each of our three adult choirs performed during the Manger Scene Open House weekend (Union Chorale, Praise Band and Glory Ringers), and soloists Carson Messics, violin; and Sierra Hohenshilt, vocal.
- -Three beautiful Christmas Eve Services led by Union Chorale, Praise Band, Glory Ringers, vocal and instrumental soloists, including the Family Service which featured our new Junior Choir and StarSong

My deep appreciation to the excellent staff at ULC with whom I am privileged to work - Gordon, Kate and Terry; to our dedicated Worship and Music Committee led so capably by chair Lynne Banzhoff; to our wonderful singers, ringers and instrumentalists who tirelessly work to learn and master fresh, new music; and to ULC's many congregational members, whose love and support make it all possible!

Finance Committee by Mike Busser

Total 2022 givings were below the prior year by 4.1% while total income was lower by 8.6% for the same time period.

Expenses for the year of 2022 were higher than the previous year by 6.0% primarily as a result of higher property expenses.

This has resulted in a loss of \$30,328 for the year of 2022 as compared to a gain of \$19,418 in 2021. We are still in a strong cash position with \$125,245 in the bank.

Our investment with Thrivent was lower by 14.1% which was significantly better than the S&P 500 stock index which was lower by 19.4% for the year.

We are optimistic that contributions will increase in 2023 to help support our continuing programs.

Review of 2023 Budget – Budget was received in the December Newsletter.

Cathy Shaffer gave a report of the budget, how the numbers have been calculated and what expenses are anticipated by committees. The 2023 Budget is an increase of 1.5% over the 2022 Budget. Because of rising costs especially with Building Maintenance this is a realistic snapshot of the 2023 budget:

Projected Income \$335,000 Projected Expenses \$381,000

Deficit \$46,000

There are cash reserves in our savings which would be a temporary solution, but is not sustainable for long term. Cathy asked members if they would pray fully consider increasing their givings by \$5 or \$10 a week? Could members consider signing up for electronic givings, that way if you are not at church on Sunday you would still be supporting the church. Another option would be to gift the church Stock. Please discuss any questions or concerns with any of the Finance Committee Members. The Finance Committee is confident that we can grown our income with everyone's help.
