In The Holy Communion, our union with Jesus and our brothers and sisters in faith reaches it's summit. Here, Jesus gives to us bread and wine, his crucified and risen Presence; his body and blood.

Unfortunately, not all of our Union Family can gather together in the Nave on Sunday mornings. However, this is where you can become involved as a Eucharistic Minister.

The **Eucharistic Ministry** provides communion for members of our congregation who are unable to attend worship. Following our worship services, Eucharistic Ministers distribute the elements of bread and wine to the sick or homebound.

Communion is delivered wherever the individual's reside. This currently includes homes, hospitals, skilled nursing facilities and assisted living communities. This process maintains a clear and strong connection between members of our congregation who are assembled in worship and those who are unable to be with us at our table of fellowship.






When Zoey Hennessey comes to claim her deceased mother's apartment at The Del-

Join us in July to discuss this book. Watch for the exact date in the weekly bulletin.



ELCA WORLD HUNGER—St. Paul, Minnesota

Rice Street Gardens in St. Paul is the second-largest community garden in the state of Minnesota, with over 250 plots for local families.

Your generosity to ELCA World Hunger, paired with the hard work of gardeners and volunteers, enables this garden to thrive.

Each gardener contributes by volunteering during the year, keeping it clean and well-organized, and donating money to buy supplies. In exchange they get to enjoy time in the garden and all the fresh veggies they grow.

A gardener at Rice Street named Elodie came to Minnesota as a refugee from the Congo five years ago. Living in Minnesota was hard for her and her daughter. They were lonely and had trouble finding jobs.

One day the Rev. Dana K. Nelson, pastor of Galilee Lutheran Church, visited Elodie at her home and invited her to join Rice Street Gardens, within walking distance of her apartment. Elodie accepted.

Now Elodie grows all kinds of vegetables at Rice Street and cooks them every day for herself and her daughter. In fact, Elodie has so many vegetables that she can keep her freezer full all winter. Yet to Elodie the garden means more than this. "When I plant my vegetables I feel at home," she says. "I feel like I have food from my country."

At the garden Elodie met a young man named Grace, who also came to the United States as a refugee from the Congo. Grace grows vegetables that he remembers from the Congo, especially a dark, leafy green called cassava leaves. Grace and Elodie tend each other's gardens, and Elodie even keeps vegetables for Grace in her freezer so

that he can have them to eat during winter too.

Rice Street Gardens provides a place where newcomers to the United States, such as Grace, Elodie and her daughter are welcomed and find connections. They make new friends; stay connected to their food, culture and people. They find ways to support their neighbors, just as Elodie does by storing Grace's vegetables in her freezer.

The gardeners and volunteers supported in part by your gifts to **ELCA World Hunger** are growing more than food — they are planting seeds for the kind of world God wants for us, a world where everyone has enough to eat, food they love, support when they need it and a strong community that welcomes and loves them.

UNION LUTHERAN CHURCH WORSHIP GUIDELINES

GREETERS/USHERS RESPONSIBILITIES

- Arrive 45 minutes early
 - Ask Pastor for any special instructions for the day's service.
 - Organize regular and children's bulletins.
 - Greet worshipers and hand out bulletins.
- When the service starts
 - Close all doors to Nave.
 - Turn off Gathering Space lights.
 - Count all congregants-including all children, pastor, acolytes, choir, organist, vocalists, instrumentalists.
- When communion begins
 - Ushers' direct congregants by row to the communion table.
 - 15-19 at a time from each side to a table via the center aisle.
 - Do not split families.

*Note: Sections to left side of center aisle (facing altar) will go to the left side of the altar rail. Sections to the right side of the center aisle will go to the right side of the altar rail. Communicants will return to their seats by exiting down the side aisle of the section in which they are seated.

- When communion is over
 - Ushers gather the offering plates from the front of the Nave and present them to the acolyte(s).

COMMUNION ASSISTANT RESPONSIBILITIES

Altar Communion Procedures

- Communion Assistants proceed to the Chancel prior to the start of communion.
 - You will be administering the wine following the pastor's distribution of the bread
- The pastor will present you with a pouring Chalice pre-filled with wine to administer to communicants.
- As you distribute the wine, please say the words of institution, "the blood of Christ shed for you".
- When all have received communion, the pastor, acolytes, and communion assistants will
 receive communion together. The pastor with administer the elements to everyone and
 one of the communion assistants will administer the elements to the pastor.
- Pastor will take care of the elements after all have been communed.

Non-Altar Communion Procedures

- Communion Assistant will proceed to the middle of the altar rail with the pastor.
- Take communion kits from the basket and distribute to each communicant saying the words of institution "the body and blood of Christ is given and shed for you".
- When all have communed, the pastor will administer communion to the Communion Assistant and acolyte. The Communion Assistant will administer communion to the pastor.

ALTAR GUILD RESPONSIBILITIES

Routine Weekly Checklist - for any service

- 1. Arrive 30 minutes early.
- 2. Change paraments for appropriate Sunday/Season.
 - a. See Church Year Calendar for proper color paraments to be used.
- 3. Check oil in altar candles and Christ candle.
 - a. Altar candle oil should last 2+ months.

WHITE and RED SUNDAYS, check oil in candelabras – it should last through two (2) services.

Altar Communion Sundays - (first Sunday of the month)

- Review Routine Weekly Checklist.
- Fill 10 communion trays (8 during summer) with cups. Fill very center cups with grape juice.
- Place communion trays on stands on either side of the center aisle.
- Place a receiving basket on stands at side aisles for used cups.
- Fill two (2) Flagons with wine place one under altar.
- Place bread on tray (slice in half lengthwise) and cover with cloth and place under altar.
- Fill one Chalice with wine, cover with Pall and place under altar, along with extra cups.
- Place and empty Chalice on altar along with bread and cover with Burse and Veil.
 - Place three (3) sanitizers in Burse.

Non-Altar Communion Sundays

- Review Routine Weekly Checklist.
 - Adjust as necessary
- Fill basket with communion kits and place on table between altar rail at the steps.
- Place a receiving basket on a table at each side aisle for used kits.

<u>Post-Service Altar Guild Clean-Up Routine</u>

- 1. Any leftover wine should either be drunk or poured outside into the ground.
- 2. Any leftover bread should either be taken home and eaten or placed outside on ground for the birds.
- 3. Wash/dry all Chalices, Flagons and store in their respective bags and placed in the cabinet.
- 4. Clean up sink and countertops.
- 5. Take linens home, remove the stains and wash and press. Be sure to return them to the Sacristy.

Baptism Procedures

- Fill baptismal font half full with warm water.
- Place shell and oil ring on font along with sanitizer.
- After service, empty water from font outside.
- Thoroughly dry font bowl.
