From Ashes to Holy Days

Before there is light there is darkness. Before there is birth, there is pain. Before every meaningful moment there is a time of preparation, a time of longing. Lent is the forty days that we set aside to enter into the wilderness of our souls and find that place of quiet, openness and emptiness. Lent is more than about self-denial and giving up indulgences, it is about preparation and encounter. It was in the desert where Jesus encountered the demons of his deepest temptations, but it was also where he found God's sustaining presence and love.

Wednesdays in Lent we will reflect on a series of poems written by Phucc Luu, Phd. Dr. Luu is an artist, philosopher theologian and a Quaker. These poems are stories about finding home. Jesus' journey is also like our journey, an attempt to capture the place of longing in every heart; it is an attempt to go back to the garden. However, as we make our way through life, we come to realize that Eden is a distant dream, a reality that we might not ever come into being. We either become cynical or attempt to build our own paradise. In contrast, Jesus' life was not about this long lost garden, but something greater, a new Eden, a new Jerusalem, a new Kingdom. However, in order to find this new home the journey might take a detour through the wilderness, and what we may find there might test the very core of who we are.



Please consider joining us as we continue our study -- "Who Is Jesus? What a Difference a Lens Makes," by Judy Yates Siker.


In February we will look through the Apostle Paul's lens and see that he stresses the cross of Christ in understanding true discipleship. (What does that mean? Come and find out!)

Our next selection is October in the Earth by Olivia Hawker. In Depression-era Kentucky, a defiant wife embarks on an impulsive and liberating journey. Del Wensley, wife of the most celebrated preacher in Harlan County, tries to mind her place. Until her husband's infidelity pushes an already strained marriage to a breaking point. Clinging to her last hope for self-respect, Del



turns her back on the rigid life she's known. A coal train is rolling through the valley. With her eyes wide open to the unfamiliar, and to the freedom she craves, Del takes to the rails. Rumbling across America, Del is soon drawn into a transient community among outcasts—and finds a special friend in Louisa Trout. A nomadic single mother, Louisa teaches Del the ways of the boxcars and promises to help her reach a migrant enclave where Del can learn the skills she'll need to survive. But as they move forward together under desperate circumstances, even the closest of bonds threatens to break. With the Depression taking its toll, Del must gather her strength and faith. As she carries on toward one unknown after another, her life becomes a fulfilling, sometimes dangerous, and exhilarating adventure. But no matter the risks, it's a life that she alone controls.

Join us Sunday, March 17 to discuss Del and Louisa, feel the pain and abject poverty that came with the Great Depression whilst also witnessing a beautiful friendship developing between two women from completely different sides of the track.



ELCA WORLD HUNGER-Iraq

This is the story of Ana, who lived with her husband and four children in a safe, secure village in Sinjar, a town in northern Iraq. But then an ISIS attack changed everything. Ana lost several family members in the attack, including her father, mother, brother and sister. Trying to figure out what might be next for their family, Ana and her husband survived tough conditions, without food or water, before moving into a temporary camp. Eventually they returned to Sinjar, but it had been destroyed.

The ISIS attack traumatized Ana. Overwhelmed and unsure where to turn, she decided to seek medical treatment. When her friends and neighbors heard about her situation, they recommended that she visit a women's center in Sinjar for support. The women's center is part of a larger project, supported by **ELCA World Hunger**, that empowers women and

youth from marginalized communities to claim their fundamental rights in Iraq. The project builds on relationships that **ELCA World Hunger** has established through prior work with local communities supported by **ELCA World Hunger** in Sinjar and Sumel, and works with local neighbors to build sustainable livelihoods.

"I visited the center and explained my situation to the staff, who were very helpful and kind," Ana says. The staff recommended that she participate in individual and group sessions aimed at supporting people such as Ana as they struggle to cope with traumatic experiences in their everyday lives.

"During my participation in those sessions, I realized

I was not alone and that many other women were facing similar struggles," says Ana. "We were able to openly discuss our problems with each other and learn from each other. These sessions really increased our awareness and helped us manage and overcome our problems and stress, allowing us to feel positive and alive again."

With the center's support, Ana and other women facing similar challenges are better equipped to cope with the stress of rebuilding their lives after such significant loss. Such support is critical in equipping neighbors to overcome the poverty and hunger that often result from violence and vulnerability. With the support of **ELCA World Hunger**, Ana can envision and begin to claim a hopeful future for herself and her family.


