#### Annual Report - Director of Music Ministries 2023 Susan Frickert

"Out with the old; in with the new." In January we said goodbye to our 2000 Rodgers organ, and hello to a 2016 Allen digital organ, an amazing gift from the people of Emmanuel UCC, Allentown, who unfortunately had needed to close their church in November 2022. The costs of disconnecting and reinstalling the new organ were made possible by generous donations from the following sponsors: Robert and Lynne Banzhoff, Ed and Anne Davis, Sherwood and Kathy Geiger, Ann Kern, Robert and Bonnie Krause, David and Gail Lafferty, Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Masetti, Sr, June McCracken, and Shirley Schneck. We joyfully dedicated our new instrument on January 29, with several members of Emmanuel singing with our choirs and many others seated within our congregation.

In February we launched a monthly Praise Service on the second Sunday of the month, led by our excellent Praise Band. After a six-month trial period, the congregation's enthusiasm for the service encouraged us to continue to make it a regular part of our worship ministry.

During Lent, cantors from Union Chorale and Praise Band took turns leading the beautiful Holden Evening Prayer for our Midweek Services.

For Easter Sunday we again combined the forces of Union Chorale and Praise Band to sing some powerful and inspiring choral music.

In May I transported our handbells and chimes to Schulmerich in Hatfield for much needed refurbishment - they came back looking and playing like new! At the end of May, Praise Band and I performed in the Benefit Concert for the kick-off of "Hearts for Music", with Jackie Bucks as the founding Director of our new Lehigh Valley branch. This wonderful organization offers the rewarding experience of making music together for children and adults with special needs.

Also in May I said my fond goodbyes to Lehigh University, after fifteen stimulating years of serving as one of two professional accompanists for Dr. Steven Sametz and Sun Min Lee, and for various vocal and instrumental instructors. I also bid farewell to my volunteer work at Moravian Hall Square Community, where I had enjoyed directing the chapel choir for the past six years.

In June we welcomed forty-seven singers from the surrounding Lehigh Valley area (eleven of them from ULC) to join in another summer of song, preparing for our second September Sacred Voices Concert here. That concert, with guest harpist Andrea Wittchen, guest violinist Linda Kistler, guest percussionists Ben Kern and Craig Mandelbaum, attracted a large appreciative crowd in spite of monsoon-type weather.

In August our Praise Band was asked to return to St. Timothy Lutheran in Allentown, to provide music for one of their WOW Summer services. This was our third year.

In September 2023, our little Junior Choir, which I had started in September 2022 with six children, had grown to nine singers. They continue to add joy and spirit to our Sunday services. StarSong, our teen ensemble of three talented young ladies, rehearses in spring and fall rehearsal modules, enriching our worship during those two eight week periods.

With the unique situation of Advent 4 and Christmas Eve occurring on the same Sunday this year, we used the opportunity to showcase some of our musically talented college students at the morning worship. We welcomed back vocalists Sierra Hohenshilt and Justin Kuhlmann; violist Brittney Lang; violinist Carson Mesics; and pianist Jordan Bucks, whose gifts made the morning worship sparkle.

My personal thanks to the members of Union Chorale, Praise Band, Glory Ringers, StarSong, Junior Choir, Worship and Music Committee (Lynne Banzhoff, chair), and to all the parents and spouses who move heaven and earth to get them to rehearsals and worship! I am so blessed to work every week with Pastor Camp, Katie Stauter and Terry Hoffman. I am grateful to so many members of the congregation who support my ministry with appreciation and love. *To God be the glory forever*!

# **2023 Financial Analysis**

December givings were the highest of the year which is normal; however, they were higher than last December by 21.9% with the Christmas Eve services higher than last year by 32.2%. Total income for December was higher than last year by 24.8% and YTD total income for 2023 was higher than last year by 5.8%.

Total expenses for December were lower than last year by 26.9% largely as a result of the basket social funds resulting in a negative expense of approximately \$6200 classified as a miscellaneous expense. Most of the remaining costs were close to the previous year except property expenses which were also lower than the previous year by 34.4% due to various reasons such as no snow removal in December.

As a result, we experienced an income gain of \$22,611 as compared to last year's gain of \$2,304. Our YTD loss was reduced to \$22,061 as compared to the 2022 loss of \$30,329 or a reduction of \$8,268. We were hoping for a strong December and the parishioners responded.
